PRICING: FULL packages include air, all transfers, and per person lodging based on double-occupancy. LAND packages do not include air. Ground transportation will be included and available on selected trips for land package participants if they can meet the group at the destination airport in time to meet the group. Ground transportation will not be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group. Check with your Trip Coordinator for ground transportation arrangements if you are choosing a land package.

Published prices do not include baggage fees, equipment rentals or lift tickets, and are subject to change. All trip deposits can be made with PayPal; however, final payment must be made by check to receive the discounted rate. Trips frequently have optional activities, such as a group dinner, or offer pre- and post-trip segments that are not reflected in the price published above. The TC is your source of information as to what is included in the package price and the cost of available options. Each trip has a different final refund' date -- that is the last date you can withdraw from the trip without a penalty. Refer to the club's Standing Rules 5.1-5.4 for the governing policies on trips, cancellations, refunds, etc.

DEPOSITS: All trips require a per person deposit to make a reservation. Currently Deposits are \$150 pp for all domestic trips, \$300 pp for international trips.


Trip Report Jackson Hole

The first stop of the tour will take us to Kariega Private Game Reserve, just a short drive from our arrival city of Port Elizabeth. **Our first three days** we stay at the reserve provides the opportunity for us to enjoy an evening wildlife safari upon arrival and then two wildlife safaris daily thereafter.

On day four we move on to Tsitsikamma (Garden Route). We will stay at Tsitsikamma Village Inn. We have the opportunity to explore the Tsitsikamma Forest. After an early breakfast is enjoyed, day five takes us to the Knysna Lagoon to enjoy the featherbed excursion over the Knysna Lagoon to the Featherbed Nature Reserve. After lunch at the reserve we continue our day's journey up the Outeniqua Pass to Oudtshoorn. In Oudtshoorn we will rest up for the night and get ready for the next day's adventure

Day six finds us traveling to the Cango Caves for a fantastic caving experience. As we leave the Cango area, we will stop at working ostrich farm to learn how this area has excelled in this industry. From there we move on towards Cape Town, along the famous Route 62.

And on the seventh day God rested but we will not as we will have a full day of touring the city of Cape Town, visiting the main attractions: Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, Cape Point, Simons Town, Boulders Beach (Penguins) and the parliament Buildings.

It will be another full day on day eight as we find ourselves touring a minimum of three wine farms, with a cellar tour and wine tasting.





Day nine finds us visiting Table Mountain and Robben Island. Table Mountain is a natural World Heritage site and a natural New Seven Wonders of the World site. It provides a magnificence backdrop to cosmopolitan Cape Town. Robben Island, originally part of the mainland, is a World Heritage Site and a poignant reminder to the newly democratic South Africa, of the price paid for freedom. Day ten finds us having to depart from Cape Town International Airport for home, full of wonderful memories and experiences of a life time. (Yes it is an 11 day tour because it takes a full day just to get to this fabulous place from Texas.)
